

CONSTRUCTION (DESIGN & MANAGEMENT) REGULATIONS 2015 CLIENTS

As the **client** you have overall responsibility for the successful management of the project, and CDM 2015 requires you to discharge a number of duties.

CDM 2015 defines a client as anyone for whom a construction project is carried out. The regulations apply to both **commercial** and **domestic** clients.

A **commercial** client is an organisation or individual for whom a construction project is carried out in connection with a business, whether the business operates for profit or not. Examples of commercial clients are schools, retailers and landlords.

You are a **domestic** client if you are having work carried out which is not connected with running a business. Usually, this means arranging for work to be carried out on the property where you or a family member lives.

Commercial Client's Duties

Make suitable arrangements for managing a project. This includes making sure that:

- other duty holders are appointed
- sufficient time and resources are allocated.

Clients must also make sure that:

- relevant information is prepared and provided to other duty holders
- the principal designer/designer and principal contractor/contractor carry out their duties
- where appropriate the project is notified to the enforcing authorities
- a Construction Phase Plan is in place
- welfare facilities are provided
- where appropriate a Health and Safety File is prepared



Domestic Client's Duties

The Domestic clients duties are the same as as the Commercial Clients duties above, but their duties as a client are transferred to:

- the contractor, on a single contractor project, or
- the principal contractor, on a project involving more than one contractor.

However, the domestic client can choose to have a written agreement for the principal designer to carry out the client duties.
